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10. b Leeds Local Plan – Scoping Consultation

Dear Council

At the June Parish Council meeting, the PC resolved to consider how it would respond to the Leeds Local Plan Scoping Consultation once it had been launched. This will therefore be discussed at the July Parish Council meeting.

The public scoping consultation is open from 24 June to 4 August 2026.

Although the PC has been granted an extension to 19 August 2026, Leeds City Council has requested that a "top-line" response is submitted by 4 August.

This initial response can then be superseded by the PC's final response following community consultation and formal approval at the Parish Council meeting on 17 August 2026.

I suggest that, in line with the mandated responsibilities, Cllr Roebuck prepares the draft response. Other PC members may wish to be considered to support with this.

I would also recommend that since this is a "top-line" response, that can be superseded that the scoping consultation document is used for the initial result.

The PC can also consider the clerk having delegated authority to submit the response on behalf of the PC in time for the deadline of 4 August.

Please find the Scoping Consultation Document attached for your reference.

Community Consultation:

The PC is asked to consider how it wishes to consult with the community on the Scoping Consultation before submitting its final response.

To allow sufficient time for review and inclusion on the August agenda, the draft PC response will need to be completed by Wednesday 12 August 2026 for approval at the Parish Council meeting on 17 August 2026.

Leeds Local Plan scoping consultation overview

What is this consultation about?

This is a scoping consultation for the Leeds Local Plan. It focuses on the overall purpose and direction of the plan and how we engage on it.

The Leeds Local Plan will set out what new development is planned to take place, where it will be and how it will look, up until 2043.

The Government has introduced a new plan-making system, and the Council is now progressing the Local Plan through the new system. In summer 2025 we gathered valuable feedback from local people on the Local Plan, and these comments will continue to be used to help shape and inform the Local Plan under the new planning system.

At this stage we are asking for views on:

- the broad topics the new Local Plan should cover; and
- how people, communities, organisations, businesses and stakeholders would like to be involved in future consultation stages.

At this stage, **we are not consulting on specific sites, detailed policy options, or proposed site allocations**, as this will be the focus of the next consultation in Winter 2026/7. We already have your comments from Summer 2025 and they are being used to help inform the next consultation. We currently expect the next main consultation to take place in **winter 2026/27**, when there will be an opportunity to comment on policy options, potential site allocation choices and supporting evidence.

Please note that in summer 2025 we gathered valuable feedback from local people on the issues and options for the new Local Plan and that the earlier feedback has been carried forward, with responses helping to progress the Plan under the new planning system.

How do I take part?

Summary of this Consultation

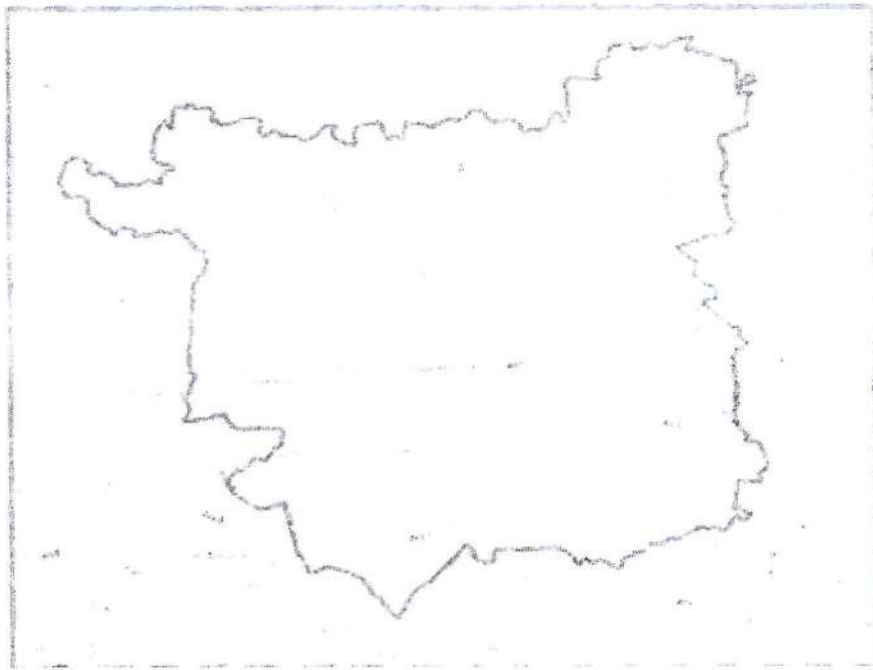
We would like your views on which general topic areas the Leeds Local Plan should cover and how you would like to be consulted as the plan is developed.

Introduction

To help everyone take part in this consultation, we have split this document into two parts. The first part includes a background to this consultation and the two consultation questions. The second part provides additional background and more detailed technical information for those who would like to know more. This includes a summary of the work already undertaken, and a summary of the new plan-making process and national policy changes.

What is the Leeds Local Plan?

The Leeds Local Plan covers the Leeds district (see plan below) and sets out where new development will be located, what it will look like, which green space and heritage assets will be protected and how infrastructure will be provided to help support new development. The plan will cover the period to 2043 and must be prepared in accordance with national legislation. Overall, the Leeds Local Plan presents a major opportunity for the Leeds district to meet the needs of all people living in the city and across the Leeds district, while protecting and conserving our best assets.



In summer 2025 we gathered valuable feedback from local people on the issues and options for the new Local Plan, and this will be used to help progress the Plan under the new planning system.

PART 1 - Background and Consultation Questions

Background to this consultation

This is the first stage in preparing the Leeds Local Plan under the new local plan-making process, which was announced by the Government in December 2025.

There are three public consultation stages in this process:

1. **Scoping Consultation:** this is the current stage. It seeks views on what the plan should contain and how people wish to be engaged in the process.
2. **Plan Content and Evidence Consultation:** this will seek views on the emerging vision for the plan, the evidence supporting it, potential policies and site options. This is planned for Winter 2026/27.
3. **Proposed Plan Consultation:** this will seek views on a full draft of the Plan. It is currently planned for Autumn/Winter 2027.

This follows a scoping consultation held in 2023 and provides a helpful opportunity to revisit and update the topics that are important to both local people and plan-making, and to have your say on how we consult in the next stages of the plan.

The aim of the Government's new local plan process is to simplify and streamline how plans are prepared, to ensure they are completed within 30 months. This means that the Leeds Local Plan will be complete in 2029.

Around 20,000 people made comments on sites and emerging policies last year. The full consultation report will be published later this year, alongside the consultation on the proposed content and evidence for the local plan. In the meantime, we have published a high-level summary of the consultation, highlighting how many people took part, how they took part, where they live and feedback on the consultation experience. We hope this will help you to understand what consultation and engagement would work best for you or your community when we consult on the plan in future.

Thank you to everyone who shared their views in previous consultations. Your feedback will be used to help shape the plan.

Question 1 - Scope of the Leeds Local Plan

We would like your views on the proposed scope of the plan. We think the plan should cover the following topics:

- **Distributing Development:** the overall approach to locating new homes, businesses and other types of development.
- **Housing and Affordable Housing:** meeting needs for new homes across the district, including homes of different types and tenures
- **Economic Development and Employment:** supporting employment by planning for the needs of businesses

Question 2 - How would you like to be consulted on the future stages of the plan?

Following this consultation, in Winter 2026/7, the Council will consult on the following:

- The draft vision for the Leeds Local Plan
- Draft planning policies for new development
- Proposed site allocations/options
- Supporting evidence

Work already undertaken on the Leeds Local plan

Accompanying this consultation is a high-level summary of the last consultation undertaken on the Leeds Local Plan ([link](#)). The feedback already received will help to shape the plans content and evidence for consultation in Winter 2026/27, but we also hope that you will find it useful in considering which forms of consultation and engagement work best for you and your community.

There have been two previous consultations on the Leeds Local Plan:

- **Spring 2023 – proposed scope:** public consultation on the proposed scope of the Plan.
- **Summer 2025 – Issues and Options:** a wide-scale consultation on draft objectives, policy approaches and a wide range of potential sites. Over 40,000 comments were received.

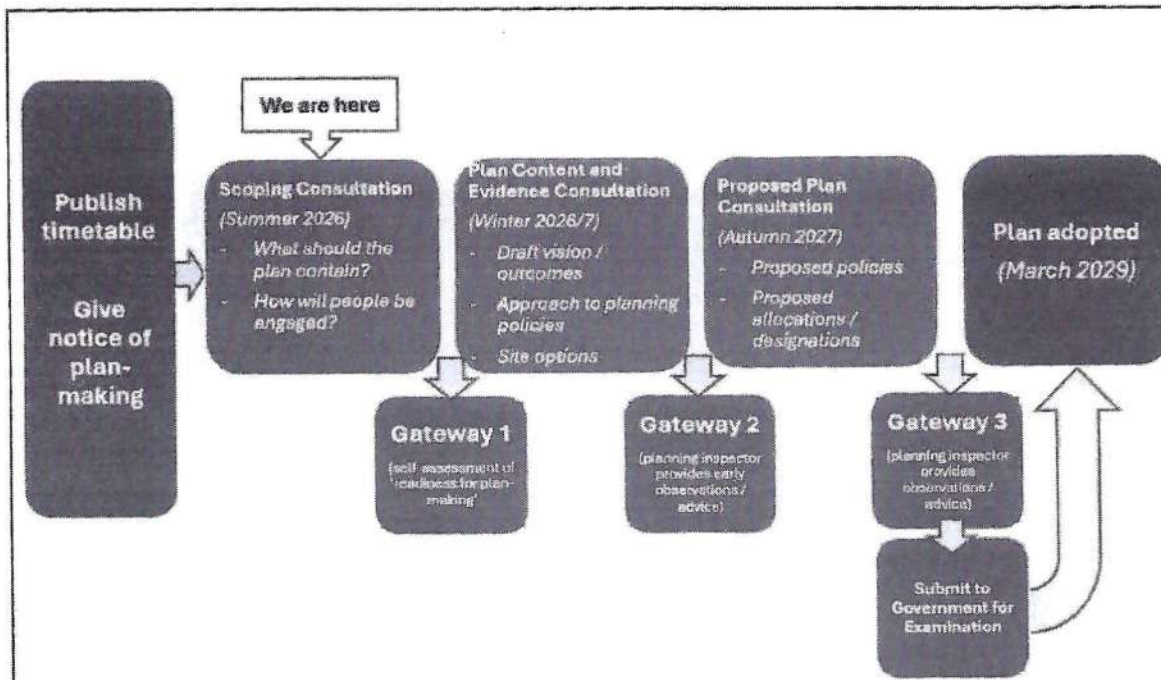
These consultations were held under the previous national regulations which means we need to consult again on the scope of the Plan.

A summary of the new plan-making process

Key features of the new plan-making system:

- Local Plans are expected to be prepared and adopted within **30 months**
- Plans are shorter and more focused on the most important local issues
- Local Plan policies will complement and not repeat national planning policies
- Three 'gateway' checks will help guide the plan to adoption, and help identify any issues at an early stage.

Summary of national planning policy changes

In March 2026 the Government concluded consultation on proposed major updates to national planning policy. The proposed changes included:

- Clarification that Local Plans should be as streamlined as possible and only include policies which extend beyond site or location-specific requirements where necessary and clearly justified.
- Proposed 'National Development Management Policies' that would provide a consistent national basis for planning decisions, reducing the need for some local planning policies.
- Limits what Local Plans can set quantitative standards for, and the extent to which Local Plans can address matters that are also considered through Building Regulations.

The final updated version of the NPPF has not yet been published, so the results of this consultation will be combined with further government announcements and will, together, shape and direct the scope of the plan.
